



It would be remiss to allow a 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary pass without pausing to reflect on key milestone events in ADEE's evolution and history. ADEE represents many things to our members and when asked to reflect on key achievements and memories we are sure that each individual will have a different perspective and highlight what they see as ADEE's ultimate achievement. We are, however, confident that to all members, ADEE is about harmonisation, consensus, collaboration, leadership and of course its people.

When I was charged by the ADEE Executive Committee (Board) to review ADEE achievements and evolve a timeline of key events synonymous with ADEE I wanted to ensure it reflected aspects of each of the five decades. To do this I decided to focus on key organisational outputs, activities and projects. The following timeline explores ADEE's foundation, leadership, the EJDE, our EU funded projects, and the professionalisation of the association through the establishment of a permanent office. It is of course not a comprehensive history, that is not its purpose. However, I hope you enjoy the selection and that the timeline sparks a fond memory or two.




#### Foundation and early beginnings

Stemming from two World Health Organisation sponsored meetings concerning dental education; undergraduate (1968 Copenhagen) and post graduate (1970 London), and facilitated through the Fédération Dentaire Internationale (FDI), European dental school deans were invited to attend a meeting in Munich in Feb 1971 to explore the need and opportunity to create an association for dental educators in Europe. The key output of this meeting was the establishment of a steering committee, and thus to quote Prof John Scott (ADEE's original Editor in Chief of the EJDE), 'the seeds of the Association for Dental Education in Europe were sown'. The steering committee met on a number of occasions between 1971 and 1975 culminating in the foundation meeting of ADEE, held in Strasbourg, France on 9th of December 1975. At this meeting 39 delegates from 18 countries set down and agreed ADEE's main purpose, constitution and bylaws.

#### 1980s and 90's founding voices and visions

ADEE was founded on and continues to be grounded in the belief that Dental Educators are best places to understand the needs and challenges of the educational environment we serve. From the outset ADEE was guided and led by a cohort of passionate individuals who volunteered their time and services to advance dental education throughout Europe and beyond. It truly was and remains concerned with what is best for society and the role we play at the intersection of the higher education, health and public sectors. Individuals not only volunteered to serve on the ADEE executive committee and officer roles, but also had an enthusiasm and passion to share their knowledge and insight, through school visits, charitable activities and to devise a best practice approach. For the first 29 years the administrative function of ADEE was serviced by volunteers without who's commitment we could never have become the association we are today. Thank you all for your vision and commitment.

### ADEE elects its first female president

While diversity has always been at the core of ADEE and all genders have actively participated from the outset, it would be 1992 before ADEE would elect its first Female President, Professor Jolán Bánoczy, Semmelweis University, Hungary. Prof Bánoczy was a highly respected colleague within FDI, IADR, ERO, and ADEE. She passed away peacefully at the age of 88 in 2016.

ADEE has had three further female presidents, Prof Cecilia Christersson, Sweden (2012-2013), Prof Stephanie Tubert-Jeannin, France (2018 – 2019) and Prof Ilze Akota, Latvia (2020-2021).

# The European Journal of Dental Education

In the run up to 1996, there was much discussion and enthusiasm around the establishment of a formal journal for the association. The then President Prof Erik Hjorting-Hansen and Editor in Chief Prof John Scott established an agreement with publishers Munksgarrd. In its initial years, the journal received circa 50 manuscripts for review annualy.

With the advent of online submission this has dramatically changed in recent years with submissions in 2024 reaching almost 500 submissions annually. The journal continues to deliver on its original mission to publish the highest quality content related to dental education and has become a flagship for ADEE.



#### The DentEd decade

Despite efforts to harmonise European legislation, curriculum standardisation, and pan-European accreditation, it became clear by the mid-1990s that such uniformity would not materialise due to fundamental regional variations in dental education and healthcare systems across Europe. The solution for European dental education lay in DentEd. As Prof. Derry Shanley (ADEE President 1996/97) put it, DentEd was seen by many as "the foster child of ADEE."

DentEd, an EU-funded thematic project, aimed to enable convergence and harmonisation. Initially planned as a three-year project, it evolved into a series of focused initiatives spanning a decade:

- DentEd (1997–2000): defined core competencies, conducted voluntary school visits, and promoted self-assessment.
- DentEd Evolves (2000–2003): expanded the network beyond Europe, hosting global conferences in Prague (2001) and Singapore (2002).
- DentEd III (2004–2007): consolidated DentEd projects, transitioned DentEd to ADEE, established the European dentist profile, and delivered the third global conference in Dublin (2007).
- DentCPD (2010–2012): an Erasmus project focused on developing guidelines for continuous professional development in dentistry.

During the DentEd years, ADEE membership grew significantly, international collaborations expanded, and its contributions gained widespread recognition in dental education.



# Establishment of the permanent office within Dublin Dental University Hospital, Trinity College Dublin

From the outset, ADEE did not have a central office nor was it registered formally. In 2004 following an increasing administrative burden linked to DentEd and the continuation of the day-to-day activities, the ADEE executive took a decision to professionalise ADEE's structure and establish a permanent central office within the Dublin Dental University Hospital.

An executive administrator was appointed for the first time with Ms Majella Giles holding this position until her retirement in 2013. Majella served ADEE with a passion and commitment for its vision and through an approach that established a sense of family amongst members. External auditors were also appointed and the Association was registered in Ireland as an unincorporated body with tax exemption.









#### **DentEd Evolves and the Global Congress**

A key output of the DentEd Evolves project was the delivery of the first Global Congress held in Prague in 2001. This was the first of three such Global Congresses, followed by Singapore 2002 and Dublin 2007. During the sessions of Global Congresses 1 & 2 work groups explored a vast array of topics from cognition and learning to governance and quality assurance. The output was published in a special edition of the EJDE Vol 6 Supplement 3 2002.

The Third congress explored global curriculum, leadership and potential future opportunities and threats to dental education. The output was again published in a special edition of the EJDE Vol 12 Supplement 1 2008. It is interesting as we again in 2025 engage in global conversations around oral health professionals' education that much of the discussions sound familiar.





#### The Graduating European Dentist

To paraphrase Prof Antonio Carrassi, the development of ADEE has historically paralleled the evolution of dental education in Europe. Its foundation stems from a need for consensus to accommodate mobility and recognition in the sense of the meaning of these words within the European legislative contexts. It is then unsurprising that in 2017 the, by now much respected and cited, Profile and Competence of the Graduating European Dentist was in need of a revisit.

Drawing on the proven success of the previous collaborative approach of the DentEd taskforces, a new taskforce that incorporated some of the original authors was convened to refresh the concept for the new decade. What evolved was the Graduating European Dentist, an updated framework to assist schools, regulators and interested parties evolve a curriculum. It was mindful of the diversity of an expanding Europe, changing agenda towards nationalism in some countries, and always true to the founding concepts of ADEE, co-created through consensus and collaboration.

#### **COVID** and its impact

Like many of our member institutions, ADEE was impacted by the arrival of COVID-19 in spring 2020. For the first time, we had to cancel our annual meeting, prompting us to develop plans to prevent future disruptions. In 2021 Strasbourg hosted our first online Annual Meeting, allowing participation in seminars over three months. While not ideal, it maintained our presence and impact. In 2022, we returned to in-person presentations in Palma, Spain, with 350 delegates.

The pandemic also led to the development of valuable online resources, such as the interactive GED webpages. and the publication of COVID-19: The Immediate Response of European Academic Dental Institutions and Future Implications for Dental Education, which has been cited over 250 times in two years. This highlights ADEE's and its members' role as a leading voice in Oral Health Professionals' Education in Europe.







# The O-Health-Edu Erasmus project

2019 saw ADEE return to the Erasmus + arena for the first time in over a decade. At the invitation of ADEE President Prof Stephanie Tubert Jeannin France, (2018 – 2019), ADEE participated as dissemination partners for what was termed the O-Health-Edu Project led by the University of Clermont Ferrand, France.

The project set a new vision and narrative for the education of Oral Health Professionals' Education and delivered on 13 intellectual outputs. One key output was a vision Oral Health Professional's Education co-signed by key stakeholders representing students, the dental profession, educators, regulators and other key partners.

To mark our 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary year and the fact that the ADEE office has now been located for 21 years within the Dublin Dental University Hospital, ADEE's former administrator Majella Giles sat down with Professor Derry Shanley to reflect on ADEE. Their discussion can be read in full on our website but we wanted to share here three key points.

Majella's connection to the work of ADEE spans 15 years.

Joining as the DentEd administrator in 1998 and seeing this work though to completion, she became ADEE's first full-time paid staff member in 2004. Her work enabled the steady growth of ADEE to become what it is today by quickly establishing a solid permanent administrative and support function for the then ADEE executive from its base in Dublin Dental University Hospital.

Derry's role with ADEE is synonymous. He brought leadership, friendship and enthusiasm for the convergence to his work on global standards in dental education. He served as both ADEE Secretary General 1990-1991 and ADEE President 1996-1997, and was also instrumental in establishing the DentEd projects and three Global Congresses on Dental education. Outside of ADEE he served as Trinity College Dublin Dean of Dental Affairs (1985-2000).







#### What for you was ADEE's greatest achievement during your term of office?



M. Giles

I think it has to be the peer-review visitations to dental schools throughout Europe initially, and expanded internationally thereafter... ADEE recognised that educational approaches differed between European countries... A Pan-European approach required generous concessions and a nuanced approach to ensure any changes were patient-orientated and considered socio-economic demographics whilst at the same time, satisfying the national dental educational requirements of individual EU member states...The DentEd approach in its first six years sought to avoid imposing a particular set of goals and outcomes but rather promoted working groups, with exchanges, findings, suggestions and recommendations. The peer influence was sufficient to prepare for DentEd III 2004-2007, which began the process of formal publication of a consensus on clinical competence, a more specific profile of the European dentist and appropriate methods of assessment, under the umbrella of a merged DentEd / ADEE.

Within the area of the Trinity campus you will find some of Irelands most well known landmarks including:



Merrion Square and St Stephen's Green are two public parks in Dublin city centre and just a short 5 minute walk from our meeting site.






# Visit the National Gallery of Art
